- 6. Todd Frank, Utility & Public Works Superintendent
 - a. Resident Driveway Washouts Happening where there is no curb and gutter, or culvert and driveways are lower than streets. This is the homeowner's responsibility, not the City's responsibility. Beaudine and Frank will meet to assess and discuss.
 - **1. Agreement** If the City does any work fixing the end of a homeowner's driveway, the homeowner will need to sign an agreement to ensure they understand this is still their responsibility, not the City's, should something go wrong. This is not part of the future road project.
 - **b. DGR Pay Request** Electrical Project is underway, and the crew has finished the underground work for now. Additional work will continue in September so as not to affect the homeowner's air conditioning use. This second pay request is \$88,080.20.

 - a. Registration of Cannabis Businesses An interim Ordinance can be put in place to temporarily ban licensed cannabis businesses within city limits. Ordinance would expire 1/1/25 and anyone licensed can sell cannabis. Consent is not to proceed with this interim Ordinance.
 - **b.** Letter There was a homeowner that was working a commercial business out of their residence. Ramstad Skoyles sent a letter stating it needed to be discontinued and it will stop.
